- 2. Explain how the Passover was commemorative and typical. (Page 93)**
- 3. What time of the year was the Passover celebrated? (Early springtime—end of March, beginning of April)**
- 4. What time of the day was the Passover lamb slain? (Exodus 12:6—9th hour or 3:00)**
- 5. Explain how the lamb was prepared and what was served with it. (Page 94)**
- 6. What does unleavened bread commemorate? (Rapid flight from Egypt—condition of the one who is covered by the blood of Christ)**
- 7. How long did they eat the unleavened bread? (One week)**
- 8. Explain the spiritual lesson in the unleavened bread and bitter herbs. (Pages 94-95)**
- 9. How was the blood from the lamb applied? (Page 95)**
