All at once the Lord arranged a generous donation, and an available vehicle with a man who needed a city car and wanted to trade the truck, at the same time! All pieces came together! This is the Technical Training College where we have a very active group, which gathers in new members all the time, as students graduate and new ones come in. December 9th, 126 prepared candidates were baptized! Praise the Lord!

We had a surprise recently as I was contacted by a new Missionary Volunteer, Brother M. Mack, who it turned out had been baptised about two years ago at B TTC. He had a burden to teach and preach the message, and had asked Pastor before he graduated, if he could start a group in his home area. Ps T. said, "Go for it!" We heard no more from him, as he had no means to contact us, although he had my email address. All at once he got a chance to use a phone and contacted right away. He has quite a story, as he returned home, his father, a member of a cult religion, refused to support him with his new beliefs, but he worked to raise up a group anyway, using the limited materials he had from the college. We have now sent him some books, Bibles and printed lessons, and plan to soon send a laptop to outfit him. The Lord has now provided him a place to stay for free, away from his father's persecution, where he can do agriculture also. This area is badly in need of the gospel truth, and we see the hand of the Lord, going ahead, raising workers, and establishing new groups without us even knowing it! Mack says; "Thank you for the reading materials I received them Friday, We met for Sabbath worship yesterday and everyone clapped hands when I told them that finally we have been identified, and now part of the big

group. We hope to have the pastor visiting too, to teach us whenever he wants so we can be empowered.”
